<p>Bookmarks</p> <p><u>Children will know:</u> - A design is a way of planning our idea before we start. - Threading is putting one material through an object.</p>	<p>Puppets</p> <p><u>Children will know:</u> - A 'joining technique' means connecting two pieces of material together. - There are various temporary methods of joining fabric by using staples, glue or pins. - Different techniques for joining materials can be used for different purposes. - A template (or fabric pattern) is used to cut out the same shape multiple times. - Drawing a design idea is useful to see how an idea will look.</p>	<p>Cushions</p> <p><u>Children will know:</u> - Applique is a way of mending or decorating a textile by applying smaller pieces of fabric to larger pieces. - When two edges of fabric have been joined together it is called a seam. - It is important to leave space on the fabric for the seam. - Some products are turned inside out after sewing so the stitching is hidden.</p>	<p>Stuffed Toys</p> <p><u>Children will know:</u> - Blanket stitch is useful to reinforce the edges of a fabric material or join two pieces of fabric. - It is easier to finish simpler designs to a high standard. - Soft toys are often made by creating appendages separately and then attaching them to the main body. - Small, neat stitches which are pulled taut are important to ensure that the soft toy is strong and holds the stuffing securely.</p>	<p>Bags</p> <p><u>Children will know:</u> - How designers use pattern pieces when creating textile products. - Nets can be folded to create 3D shapes. - Safety pins can hold fabric in place before sewing. - Consistently sized stitches improve the aesthetic of a product. - The shape of an object can affect both its aesthetics and function. - Aesthetics is how something looks. - Complete products are sometimes made in parts that are sewn together.</p>

As above	As above	<p>Pouches</p> <p><u>Children will know:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Sewing is a method of joining fabric.-Different stitches can be used when sewing.-The importance of tying a knot after sewing the final stitch.-A thimble can be used to protect my fingers when sewing.	<p>Fastenings</p> <p><u>Children will know:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- A fastening is something which holds two pieces of material together for example a zipper, toggle, button, press stud and velcro.-Different fastening types are useful for different purposes.-Creating a mock up (prototype) of their design is useful for checking ideas and proportions.
